Constitutional Carry

HB 1238 by Biedermann, HB 1927 by Schaefer, HB 2900 by Hefner, & SB 540 by Springer recognize the right of those who can legally possess a firearm to carry it, open or concealed, without a permit. HB 1587 or HB 1911 by White, if passed along with HB 821, achieve the same result. See more: txgoa.us/cc.

SJR 24 by Hall proposes to amend the TX Constitution to prohibit the Legislature from requiring a license or permit to carry a gun.

End "Gun-Free" Zones

SB 546 by Springer repeals the prohibited places for handgun carry in Penal Code 46.03 & 46.035.

SB 514 by Hall allows LTC holders to carry concealed in K-12 schools.

Domestic Violence Victim Defense

HB 1094 by Oliverson / SB 545 by Springer allow those 18+ who can legally possess a firearm and who are protected by a restraining order to carry a handgun, open or concealed, without a license. It would also exempt such people from "gun-free" zones (TX Penal Code 46.03 & 46.035).

Curtail Emergency Powers

HB 26 by Swanson, HB 340 by Cain, HB 629 by White, HB 1690 by Tinderholt & SB 547 by Springer repeal the Governor's emergency powers to regulate or control the sale, transportation, and use of firearms and ammunition. HB 1500 by Hefner & SB 18 by Creighton do the same, and also keep state & local government from shutting down gun businesses during an emergency.

HJR 40 by White proposes an amendment to the Texas Constitution to remove a Governor's power to suspend or limit the sale or transport of firearms.

Second Amendment Sanctuary State

These bills prohibit Texas from using its personnel or resources to enforce Federal gun-grab laws, and withhold state grant money from any entities that try to help enforce such regulations.

- HB 635 by Krause / SB 541 by Springer (require the Attorney General to intervene to stop violation and to protect from Federal suits)

"Made in Texas"

HB 915 by Krause / SB 542 by Springer exempt a class of "Made in Texas" firearms, ammunition, and accessories from Federal regulations, and give a way to secure a court judgment on the constitutionality of this law before someone manufactures "Made in Texas" items.

Suppressor Freedom

HB 957 by Oliverson / SB 543 by Springer repeal Texas law that criminalizes suppressor possession apart from Federal regulations and establish a "Made in Texas" suppressor and court judgment similar to HB 915 / SB 542 (above).

Anti-"Red Flag" Law

HB 336 by Cain / SB 548 by Springer keep Texas out of any Federal "Red Flag" gun confiscation scheme and prohibits localities from implementing "Red Flag" style policies on their own.

Domestic Violence Victim Defense

HB 1094 by Oliverson / SB 545 by Springer allow those 18+ who can legally possess a firearm and who are protected by a restraining order to carry a handgun, open or concealed, without a license. It would also exempt such people from "gun-free" zones (TX Penal Code 46.03 & 46.035).

Curtail Emergency Powers

HB 26 by Swanson, HB 340 by Cain, HB 629 by White, HB 1690 by Tinderholt & SB 547 by Springer repeal the Governor's emergency powers to regulate or control the sale, transportation, and use of firearms and ammunition. HB 1500 by Hefner & SB 18 by Creighton do the same, and also keep state & local government from shutting down gun businesses during an emergency.

HJR 40 by White proposes an amendment to the Texas Constitution to remove a Governor's power to suspend or limit the sale or transport of firearms.

Second Amendment Sanctuary State

These bills prohibit Texas from using its personnel or resources to enforce Federal gun-grab laws, and withhold state grant money from any entities that try to help enforce such regulations.

HB 957 by Oliverson / SB 543 by Springer repeal Texas law that criminalizes suppressor possession apart from Federal regulations and establish a "Made in Texas" suppressor and court judgment similar to HB 915 / SB 542 (above).

Anti-"Red Flag" Law

HB 336 by Cain / SB 548 by Springer keep Texas out of any Federal "Red Flag" gun confiscation scheme and prohibits localities from implementing "Red Flag" style policies on their own.
